

THE DALCROZE EURHYTHMICS INTERNATIONAL EXAMINATION BOARD (DEIEB)

The Dalcroze Eurhythmics International Examination Board (DEIEB) was founded by a group of holders of the Diplôme Supérieur of the Institut Jaques-Dalcroze, Geneva with a view to harmonising their professional training programmes and qualifications in Dalcroze Eurhythmics. The DEIEB offers training and examinations at four levels:

Foundation: a foundation course in Dalcroze Eurhythmics and a basis of the training. Although this is not a professionally qualifying exam in itself, it forms part of the overall professional training package and those who wish to train at the Intermediate level must be in possession of a foundation Award¹ unless they have received dispensation from their Directors of Studies (see footnote below).

Intermediate: The Intermediate Award entitles holders to state that they use Dalcroze principles in their own professional practice. It also forms the second level of professional training. Those who wish to train for the Professional Certificate in Dalcroze Eurhythmics must be in possession of the DEIEB Intermediate Award (see footnote below).

Professional Certificate: The professional certificate entitles the holder to teach Dalcroze Eurhythmics and is the first professional qualification. Those who wish to train for the Professional Certificate and to take the exams must be in possession of a DEIEB intermediate Award (see footnote below).

Licence: the Licence entitles holders to teach advanced students and to assist in professional training where appointed to do so by the Director of Studies. Applicants for the Licence course and exams must be in possession of a DEIEB Professional Certificate (formerly called the Certificate). Holders of a DEIEB Licence who intend studying for the Diplôme Supérieur may apply to take the entrance examinations at the Institut Jaques-Dalcroze, Geneva.

The Diplôme Supérieur is the highest qualification in Dalcroze Eurhythmics and can only be obtained from the Institut Jaques-Dalcroze, Geneva. Holders of the Diplôme Supérieur may themselves direct training programmes (see Conditions governing the use of the name Jaques-Dalcroze [or Dalcroze]).

Qualifications granted by the DEIEB are recognised by the Institut Jaques-Dalcroze, Geneva because the DEIEB complies with the Conditions governing the use of the name Jaques-Dalcroze (or Dalcroze). These conditions require all programmes leading to Dalcroze certification to be led by a Programme Director or Director of Studies who oversees the entire programme content, delivery and examination and appoints suitably qualified teachers to teach. At least two holders of the Diplôme Supérieur must be involved in training. The Board only examines candidates from accredited training programmes whose Directors of Studies are themselves Co-Directors or associate Directors of the Board. It does not examine candidates from training programmes that do not comply with the conditions governing the use of the name Dalcroze as to do so would put the Board at risk of losing its own accreditation.
